

General Rules and Conduct

The Rules of the Oklahoma City Golf & Country Club have been designated the best interest of the entire membership so that the facilities may be enjoyed by all. Members and Guests are respectfully urged to observe them.

Conduct of Members, their families, and guests while using the Clubhouse facilities shall be the responsibility of each Member. Violations of House Rules in addition to those specifically enumerated in the Bylaws shall include profanity, loud or boisterous conduct, and personal confrontation or berating of any of the managerial staff, waiters, waitresses, or other Club personnel. Any infraction of the Rules by a Member, his family or his guests which infringes upon the enjoyment, use, and welfare of the Club by other Members shall be considered a violation subject to disciplinary action as set out in Paragraph B of the House Rules.

At no time are the following items of apparel acceptable anywhere: cut-offs, cargo shorts, and short-shorts. Frayed or tattered cut-off shorts or jeans. Clothing with offensive language. Caps, hats, and visors for men and boys are not allowed in the social or dining areas. Gentlemen will remove their headwear where appropriate. Caps and hats, if worn, shall be worn with the brim facing forward. Caps may be worn only in the following areas: Golf Pro Shop, Men's and Ladies' Locker Rooms, and Ladies' grill

Shirts and shoes are required at all times except in the pool area. Footwear requiring laces must be laced and tied.

Children age ten and older must comply with the dress codes.

Dress Code Descriptions

OKCGCC Casual – Collared shirt, mock or turtleneck is acceptable for men and boys tucked-in unless designed to be worn otherwise. Tailored pants, including jeans, or dress shorts must be worn by men. Dresses, skirts, tailored pants, including jeans, or dress shorts must be worn by women.

Standard golf and tennis apparel are acceptable. Sandals and flip flops are permitted.

OKCGCC Business Casual – Slacks, collared shirt, mock or turtleneck is acceptable for men and boys tucked-in. Jackets are required. Dresses, slacks, skirts, blouses, sweaters, and jackets are acceptable for women.

Black Tie – Tuxedo or dinner jacket is for men and cocktail or ball attire for the ladies.

Gallery Grill – OKCGCC Casual

1911- OKCGCC – Casual; however, tennis attire, sweatpants, and flip flops are not permitted.

Ladies' Grill - OKCGCC casual.

Men's Grill - OKCGCC casual.

Club Functions – Specific attire will be posted for themed events at the Club.

Golf Attire

All golfers must wear proper golf attire when playing golf or using the practice range, putting, green, chipping green, and the Golf Performance Center. All

golfers are expected to look neat, clean, and presentable. Jeans, jean shorts, cargo shorts, cut-offs, tennis shorts, tee shirts, tank tops, jogging clothes, halter tops, and workout clothing are not acceptable dress.

The length for ladies' shorts, skorts and skirts are not to exceed four inches about the knee. Men's shirts are to be tucked in at all times. Golf shoes are mandatory, and metal or spider spikes are not permitted. Junior golfers are expected to abide by these same guidelines. Members and guests must use the locker room for changing.

Tennis Attire

Players must dress in appropriate tennis attire. All footwear must be non-marking, running shoes and cross-training shoes are prohibited. The Athletic Director, or the Senior Pro on duty, shall be responsible for the interpretation and enforcement of this rule.

Athletic Center

Proper workout attire is required at all times. No bathing suits, cut-offs, jeans, sandals, bare feet, etc. shall be permitted. Shirts are required.

Swimming Pool – All attire should be kept in good taste in the family concept of the Club. Proper swimming attire required. Speedos and thongs are not acceptable. Acceptable jeans and shorts are permitted. Wet swimsuits are not acceptable in the Dive-In-Diner. Swim attire is not acceptable outside the pool areas.

The Shack – Hats and caps are acceptable. Standard golf and tennis apparel are acceptable.

Cellphones – Cellphones must be set to silent inside the clubhouse and the Athletic Center. The use of cellphones is limited to non-vocal communication (texting and e-mail) in dining areas and the Athletic Center. If vocal use is necessary, one must remove themselves from the areas until the call is completed. The exception to the rule is in the Men's and Ladies' Grill where vocal communication is permitted.
